

Tal Benatar is an Israeli-American conductor, arranger, and guitarist and is finishing his studies towards a DMA in Orchestral Conducting at the University of Michigan. In addition to serving as Music Director of the MPO, Tal has also been the Music Director of the U-M Life Sciences Orchestra since June 2019.

As a genre-defying musician, Tal has performed repertoire spanning many centuries on many instruments, including organ, harpsichord, and guitar. A strong advocate of new music, Tal has conducted world premieres by four University of Michigan composers, has been featured as a guitar soloist with University of Michigan's Orpheus singers, and has performed new music with the U of M Contemporary Directions Ensemble for composers Nico Muhly, Julia Wolfe, and David Lang. Tal also collaborates regularly with students and faculty, conducting in many recitals within the University of Michigan School of Music, Theatre, and Dance.

Tal graduated from the University of Michigan in 2018 with an M.M. in Orchestral Conducting, studying with Professor Kenneth Kiesler. He completed his B.A. at the University of Virginia (UVA) in 2014, majoring in Political Science with a concentration in US Constitutional Law. Tal is also a Certified Personal Trainer and enjoys staying active and cooking delicious, healthy food to stay afloat during these COVID times.


JESSICA WU

Reflecting & Celebrating

Twenty-five years ago, a group of like-minded dreamers took the stage at the Michigan Theater. With a wave of the conductor's wand, the dramatic percussion beats of Fanfare for the Common Man erupted into the evening, and a cascade of trumpet notes heralded the start of a concert seven months in the making. For sixty-three students, it was the culmination of everything they had worked for, and everything they had hoped for. Together, they had announced the arrival of the Michigan Pops Orchestra.

I remember that night well, and all the blood, sweat, and tears we had poured into our passion project that year. But what made Pops special for us was not that we had dared to play Danny Elfman's Batman theme while whirling the Bat symbol around the auditorium (although that was super cool!). What made Pops special for us was that every second of that concert was a moment we had created all on our own. There was something uniquely gratifying in knowing that our performance was 100% student-led, student-directed, student-imagined, and student-loved. Although the phrase Pops Love would become the orchestra's unofficial motto years later, I feel that we had loved that orchestra into existence right away.

No one could have envisioned what would happen next though. As new voices added their own rich stories each year, Pops grew. Ideas like Pops Progressive, the Pops Screen Actors Guild, and Pops Pals sprung out of creative minds and turned into traditions. Sunday afternoon practices at Revelli Hall became a time to not only play fun music but to connect with friends and a new family. Pops became a place to find oneself, experience some of life's immeasurable lessons, and belong to something greater. For some, Pops would even go on to define their time at the University of Michigan and beyond.

For myself, I still like to say that I majored in Pops. It remains the single best thing I have done in my life (aside from marrying my wife and raising our three children of course). What brings me the most joy is learning about an upcoming concert, wondering what special adventures might have occurred, and knowing that it was all lovingly crafted and created by kindred spirits. I eagerly await to find out what the 25th Anniversary concert has in store for us. I can think of no better company to celebrate this with than with my Pops Family.
